Use the maps on page 287 to complete the following tasks:



Step 1: Label the following colonies:

- Argentina
- Colombia
- Mexico
- Bolivia
- Ecuador
- Peru
- Brazil
- Haiti
- Venezuela
- Chile

Step 2: Under the label of each colony record the date of independence

Step 3: Label the Following Cities that were established as colonial symbols of authority

- Buenos Aires
- Mexico City
- Havana
- Sao Paulo
- Lima

Step 4: Label the following bodies of water

- Pacific Ocean
- Atlantic Ocean
- Caribbean Sea
- Gulf of Mexico

Step 5: Shade each colony a different color according to its colonial mother.

- France=Green
- Portugal: Yellow
- Spain: Red

Step 6: Provide the following icons on each country that identifies the independence leader that freed it:

- Toussaint: an "x"
- Simon Bolivar: a triangle
- Dom Pedro: a circle
- San Martin: a square
- Father Hidalgo: a cross +

Step 7: Draw a line around ALL of Central and South America. Color it Blue and label is MONROE DOCTRINE
