


INTRODUCTION

The Quartermaster Supply Catalog, formerly issued as OQMG Circular No. 4, is divided into five (5) Sections:

Section I—Enlisted Men's Clothing and Equipment

Section II—WACs' and Nurses' Clothing and Equipment

Section III-Chests, Kits, and Sets

Section IV—Post, Camp, and Station Equipment

Section V-Miscellaneous

Each Section contains:

- a. Introduction and instructions necessary to the clarity of the section.
- b. An Alphabetical Index.
- c. Illustrations and descriptions of the principal items contained in the section.

The illustrations and descriptions appearing in this Catalog are for the convenience and guidance of those concerned so that they may become familiar with the general appearance of the various items. Types and specifications will vary from time to time; therefore, the illustrations cannot always be used in the case of surveys; over, short, and damage reports; or in connection with procurement.

The only authority for the requisition and issue of the items contained in this Catalog will be found in Tables of Equipment, Tables of Allowances, authorized special lists of equipment, and OQMG Circular No. 1-18, Allowance of Expendable Supplies.

Certain items of equipment containing components and accessories, which require several pages to list and describe, are illustrated as an assembled unit. The descriptions contain references to an appropriate Technical Manual or Circular wherein the article and its components and accessories are illustrated and described. Examples of such items are Range, Field, M-1937, and Semi-Trailer, 2-Wheel, Van Type, Mobile, Sterilization and Bath, Complete.

Section I contains Enlisted Men's Clothing and Equipment. This section is subdivided into several groupings. Groupings are listed in the Table of Contents and are page-titled on the outside upper corner of each page. The articles in each subdivision have been grouped in relation to their use whenever practical. Each item is listed under its correct nomenclature and stock number. A complete index listing every item alphabetically and the respective page on which it is found is contained at the end of the section.

Where an item has a number of sizes, it is impractical to list the stock numbers of each size in this Catalog. For example, Shoes, Service, which appear on Page 1, have a reference to the full range of sizes that the stock numbers cover; i.e., Stock Number 72-S-1806-35 thru 72-S-2173. To find the stock number for a specific size, use the Q-Supplement to the Federal Standard Stock Catalog. In the event the Federal Standard Stock Catalog is not available, requisitions will show standard nomenclature and sizes, omitting stock number.

As the necessary data and information is compiled and published, the remaining sections of the Quartermaster Supply Catalog will be issued. Each section will be a complete unit in itself, and will be saddle wire stitched and punched so that all sections may be bound together in a standard 3-ring binder. As changes are made, either a supplement to the pertinent section will be issued, or the entire section revised.

SHOES, SERVICE, COMPOSITION SOLE

Stock No. 72-S-2223-20-72-S-2253-70

This shoe is the same as the shoes, service, with the exception that there is an outside tap of reclaim rubber which gives at least twice the wear obtained from leather. The issue of this shoe is confined to the United States.





SHOES, SERVICE Stock No. 72-S-1806-35-72-S-2173

A welt constructed shoe, blucher pattern, with $\frac{1}{2}$ bellows tongue, outside counter pocket, full toe vamp, toe cap (without box toe), heavy first quality bend outersole, slip tap, and reclaim rubber heel. The upper leather is best quality, heavy, Army Russet shade, side leather fully chromed and vegetable retanned. The shoe is unlined.

SHOES, SERVICE, HOB-NAIL Stock No. 72-S-2265-10—72-S-2273-22


This shoe is made like the shoes, service, with the exception that it carries two (2) full length leather soles and has the forepart hob-riveted and the heel is all leather and either hob-riveted or steel rimmed. This shoe is issued on special requisition only.

SHOES, SERVICE, REVERSE UPPER, COMPOSITION SOLE Stock No. 72-S-2350-10—72-S-2357-62

This shoe is made with flesh out upper leather and crude rubber sole and heel. The shoe has no toe cap. The issue of this shoe is reserved for overseas use and should not be issued in this country.

SHOE, SERVICE, REVERSE UPPER, HOB RIVETED Stock No. 72-S-2363-15-72-S-2369-22

These shoes are the same as shoes, service, reverse upper, composition sole, except that they have a leather sole and heel and are hob riveted. The issue of this shoe is reserved for overseas use.



LIMITED STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted.

Shoes, gymnasium, have a low quarter, canvas top and a white molded rubber sole. They are used by the Amphibian Force wherever footing is precarious. The shoes, boat, safety-sole, are slowly replacing the shoes, gymnasium.

BOOTS, JUMPER, PARACHUTE Stock No. 72-B-217—72-B-336-20

A 10'' boot having a rubber tap and rubber heel. It is fitted in such a way to provide maximum support for the ankle.

BOOTS, LEATHER, LACE, LEGGING TOP Stock No. 72-B-829—72-B-846-72

This is a boot used by the Cavalry. It is made of welt construction 17" high, blucher pattern with wrap legging top, three (3) straps, $\frac{1}{2}$ bellows tongue, full toe blucher vamp, toe cap (no box), unlined, leather sole with slip tap and one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) rubber heel. The upper is cut from the best quality, heavy weight, chrome tanned, dress elk sides, Army Russet shade.

SHOES, LOW QUARTER, TAN Stock No. 72-S-753-62-72-S-759-87

A dress type of oxford now provided principally to the Medical Corps. It is not distributed to the regular Enlisted Men.







BOOTS, SKI-MOUNTAIN

LIMITED STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted

Stock No. 72-B-2800-32-72-B-2811-66

A combination boot intended for both skiing and mountain climbing. It is constructed on a last having a rocker bottom in order to facilitate walking or climbing, and the square toes and grooved heels are designed to fit ski bindings.



BOOTS, SKI-MOUNTAIN, WITH RUBBER CLEATED SOLE Stock No. 72-B-2845-50-72-B-2851-16

This boot has superseded boots, ski mountain, and boots, ski mountain with tricouni nails. It is similar except that it has a rubber cleated sole in place of a plain leather sole or leather sole with



CREEPERS, ICE Stock No. 74-C-311

An adjustable, short spiked plate which is attached by straps and buckles to the sole of the shoe and used to give secure footing where icy conditions prevail (used chiefly around airports).

INSOLES, FELT Stock No. 72-I-550—72-I-580

A pressed felt insole made of cattle hair and wool. They are shipped inside shoe pacs; boots, ski-mountain; boots, blucher, high top; and mukluks. In each instance the insole is cut to the proper shape to fit the boot or shoe. Felt insoles for replacement are shipped in block form and are to be cut by the men in the field to the shape required. The insole is used for insulation and to absorb moisture. It is kept in the boot or shoe only when actually being used. As soon as the footwear is taken off it must be removed and dried.

STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted.

A set of hard steel and tricouni type nails for use on boots, ski-mountain, to get a safe grip on ice, snow, rock, steep grass, gravel, etc. They are used on boots, ski-mountain, where difficult mountainous terrain is likely to be encountered.



A short canvas legging used to prevent snow from entering the top of the boot, ski-mountain.

PROTECTORS, SOLE, SKI-BOOT Stock No. 72-P-10005

A metal protector, screwed and nailed to the edge of the sole of the boot, ski-mountain, where they will' be in contact with the side of the bindings, ski, to prevent the leather from softening and wearing at the points of contact.

CRAMPONS, MOUNTAIN Stock No. 74-C-310-50 Large size Stock No. 74-C-310-55 Small size

Figure 1—A steel framework with spikes 1½ inches long used on boots and shoes when steep ice must be climbed. The spikes dig into the ice, give secure footing, and allow the soldier to advance more quietly, faster and with less energy than with any other type of footgear. Crampons may also be used on steep grass slopes. Figure 2—The crampon affixed to the boot, ski-mountain, nailed.

LIMITED STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted.



BOOTS, BLUCHER, HIGH TOP Stock No. 72-B-128-8-72-B-133-18

A boot, 12" in height, constructed in such a manner as to be more waterproof than other types of leather footwear. It is intended for wet, cold areas.

SHOE PAC, LOW SHOE PAC, HIGH SHOE PAC, 12-INCH Stock No. Stock No. Stock No. 72-S-8598-72-S-8620 72-S-8400-72-S-8420 72-S-8750-72-S-8770

The shoe pac, low, has a leather top 10 inches high and a rubber foot, whereas the shoe pac, high, has a leather top 16 inches high and a rubber foot. They are used in wet weather and under cold conditions down to 10° F., worn with a removable felt innersole and with two or more pairs of heavy socks.

The shoe pac, 12-inch, is the same as the shoe pac, low, and shoe pac, high, except in the height of the leather top and in the method of attaching the top to the sole. When the stock of the shoe pac, low, and shoe pac, high, is exhausted the shoe pac, 12-inch, will be issued.

OVERSHOES, ARCTIC Stock No. 72-O-275-72-O-295

LIMITED STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted.

The overshoe, Arctic, now being procured by the Quartermaster Corps is known as the four (4) buckle, cloth top type. It is worn over the service shoe and is issued in certain areas in this country and out of this country where snow and cold wet conditions require an extra covering over the service shoe. It may also be used with socks and insoles alone in cold weather. The basis of issue has recently been changed from one (1) pair to every man to one (1) pair to every man in the areas indicated.

OVERSHOES, ARCTIC, ALL RUBBER Stock No. 72-O-398-72-O-422

LIMITED STANDARD - To be issued until exhausted.

BOOTS, MUKLUK Stock No. 72-B-1130—72-B-1132

This is the warmest type of footwear issued and is used in extremely cold climates. It has a bottom made of dry tanned kipskin or buckskin and a fabric top. The boot is permeable allowing perspiration of the feet to evaporate rather than confining it within the boot causing freezing of the feet. It is worn with a burlap or felt innersole and a combination of wool and ski socks. Its principal value is that it is roomy, allowing the use of many pairs of socks without constricting the foot. As it is not waterproof it cannot be used in weather warmer than $+20^{\circ}$ F or in wet snow.

BOOTS, JUNGLE Stock No. 72-B-340-30-72-B-341-60

Boots, jungle, are used under tropical conditions where resistance to the action of jungle conditions is necessary. The regular issue leather shoe will not stand up as well under the constant wet conditions of the tropics. Boots, jungle, are made to provide adequate ventilation and have a fabric upper that may be easily washed and cleaned. The sole is a composition rubber sole similar to a basketball shoe for wearing qualities. This boot will also serve as a mosquito boot.



OVERSHOES, BOAT, SAFETY-SOLE Stock No. 72-0-755-72-0-765

This is an all rubber, five (5) buckle shoe worn over regular shoes and used by the Amphibious Forces. The sole is so constructed that it grips well on slippery surfaces.



SHOES, BOAT, SAFETY-SOLE Stock No. 72-S-62-20--72-S-65-30

An oxford type shoe with a canvas top and a sole which grips well on slippery surfaces. It is used by the Amphibious Forces.



SHOES, CLIMBING, ROPE-SOLE Stock No. 72-S-70-25-72-S-70-85

A rope-soled, split leather top shoe, used where high angle rock climbing is necessary and under other conditions which require very good footing on wet rock.

BOOTS, RUBBER KNEE, M-1937 Stock No. 72-B-1261-72-B-1271

The knee boot is an ankle fitting all rubber boot with a laced throat just below the knee. Boots as a rule are used almost entirely by the Engineers.



BOOTS, RUBBER, HIP Stock No. 72-B-1149-72-B-1168


An all rubber boot reaching to the hip and being held up by a strap connected with either a belt or suspenders.





Waders, over-the-shoe, are a combination of the hip boot and an overall, made entirely of rubber. The waders reach up under the arm pits and across the chest and back and fit reasonably tight to effect a fairly good water seal. The wader is put on over the service shoe, as its title indicates, and is worn by a man unloading boats when establishing a beach head or in deep water construction work.

LEGGINGS, CANVAS, M-1938, DISMOUNTED, od Stock No. 72-L-61883-72-L-61903

This legging is used by all Enlisted Men. It is made of No. 6 duck, measures 123/4" in height. It is laced by means of hooks and eyelets; fastened to the service shoe, by means of a Webbing Strap; furnished in four (4) sizes-R1 to R4 in Olive Green Color.

LEGGINGS, CANVAS, M-1938, DISMOUNTED, od, PROTECTIVE Stock No. 72-L-62027-72-L-62048

This legging is the same as the leggings, canvas, M-1938, dismounted, od, with the exception that it is made protective and issued only at the Port of Embarkation.

SHOES, BALLOON, INSPECTION Stock No. 72-S-50-72-S-52

Shoes, balloon, inspection, are similar to the window dresser sock. They are made of cotton flannel and no wool in order to avoid static electricity and are used by the Barrage Balloon Repair Crew, worn over the sock without shoes, in order to avoid bruising the fabric of the balloon.





Socks, wool, cushion sole, consist of 50% wool and 50% cotton. The heels, toes and soles of the socks are superimposed with reinforced wool. The photo on the right shows the sock inside out and illustrates the cushioned sole.



SUIT, ONE-PIECE, JUNGLE Stock No. 55-S-46010—55-S-46047

LIMITED STANDARD—To be issued until exhausted.

This one-piece, camouflaged uniform is especially developed to give maximum protection against insects and thorns while permitting the wearer to remain as cool as possible. It is provided with internal fabric suspenders that permit the crotch of the uniform to be raised or lowered so that the weight of the cargo pockets can be carried with comfort, suspended from the shoulders. The jungle suit has large cargo pockets, with flaps held down by stout friction snaps.

The camouflaged patterns, green on the outside and tan on the inside, permit the garment to be reversed so that the troops may have a camouflaged uniform suitable for action on beaches or sun-baked areas as well as in normal, green jungle.

A one-piece work suit similar to the commercial work garment.

This jacket is made of herringbone twill with a camouflage pattern. It has composition buttons instead of metal and special sleeve closure.

A short, wool blouse for winter dress wear.





A full length overcoat of heavy weight wool cloth.

A short top coat of heavy weight poplin with convertible collar.



PARKA, WET WEATHER Stock No. 72-P-2510—72-P-2525

Parka, wet weather, is made from waterproof, two ply laminated material combined with a synthetic resin.



OVERCOAT, PARKA TYPE, SHEEPSKIN LINED Stock No. 55-0-3133—55-0-3140

Overcoat, parka type, sheepskin lined, is a full length overcoat of wind resistant, water repellent cotton cloth with sheepskin lining set in. There is also a permanently attached hood of the same material for additional warmth.



The pile liner is separate from the outer shell to facilitate drying and adjustment to fit variation in temperatures.

COATS AND JACKETS




A windproof, water repellent jacket for Mountain Troops. The hood can be folded underneath the collar. There are four (4) large roomy pockets in the front and a large cargo pocket extending across the back, similar to the type found in many hunting jackets. The large number of pockets makes it possible to carry many items when it is not desired to wear the rucksack. The suspenders attached inside the jacket help to support and distribute the weights in the cargo


Fig. 3—Canteen fits into cup, whose handle folds, for compact carrying.




Fig. 2—Climbers Fostened on the Tip of the Skis





Fig. 1—Brown and White Models

Climbers, ski, mountain, are strips of Mohair fabric worn on the bottom of skis to prevent back sliding, when climbing steep snow slopes. The climbers are held to the skis by non-freezing, bucklet straps, which can be removed while wearing gloves. Both the white and brown models may be issued at the present time, but the brown has been superseded by the white.





Fig. 1-The use of the binding


Fig. 2—A shoe pac, low, fitted to the binding

Pad, snowshoe, is a pad of hard rawhide to be laced to the webbing of the snowshoe when it is used with nailed boots with hard soles.

Snowshoe, bearpaw, is a standard type shoe of particular value in area where there is a great deal of brush and other obstructions on the ground, or in steep broken terrain. Either the shoe pac or mukluk is worn. The nailed boot, ski-mountain, can also be worn with the addition of a pad to protect the rawhide from being cut.


BINDING, SNOW-SHOE, EMERGENCY Stock No. 74-B-303


Two rawhide thongs, 55-inches long, for use in an emergency as a binding for skis or snowshoes and for any other purposes where a strong rawhide lashing is needed to effect temporary repairs to equipment.



SNOWSHOES, EMERGENCY, 10½" × 20" Stock No. 74-5-309

A small size, extremely light snowshoe for use of troops operating in deep snow where skis cannot always be used, as in actual combat. Normally for footwear, either the shoe pac or the boot, mukluk, is worn. The nailed boot, ski-mountain, can also be worn with the addition of a pad to protect the rawhide from being cut. The snowshoe on the right is shown with the binding, snowshoe, emergency, which is used as the binding for the snowshoe.







BRUSH, MOUNTAIN Stock No. 74-B-791

Brush, mountain, is a stiff brush particularly useful to troops camped on snow. It is used to brush snow and frost from clothing and equipment and to keep the tent floor clean.

ADAPTORS, SKI Stock No. 74-A-25 BAND, CONTRACTION Stock No. 41-B-46


Fig. 1—Adaptors, ski, are a set of aluminum blocks.

Fig. 4—An emergency sled made from the sack removed from the rucksack, the two frames, two pairs of skis, four pairs of adaptors, ski, and four bands, contraction. Upon this emergency sled an injured soldier can be evacuated, or supplies moved forward.

The bands, contraction, can also be used to clamp the tip of a broken ski onto the balance of the ski, permitting the skier to travel after he has broken his ski tip.



MARKERS, TRAIL Stock No. 74-M-123

A maple dowell $36'' \times \frac{1}{4}''$, with the top eight inches painted black or orange. They are used to mark trails on glaciers, snow fields or where the marking of trails is desirable, especially in areas where intermittent snow or wind storms are apt to occur.

AXE, ICE, MOUNTAIN

An implement used by Mountain Troops for cutting steps in steep ice and snow and for probing for crevasses on glaciers. The shaft is also used as a point around which the mountain rope can be snubbed by one member of a roped party to stop the others from falling in the event of a slip on steep terrain. As a walking stick it reduces the weight on the legs and aids the balance, especially when heavy loads are carried. When the pick end of the head is shoved into turf, gravel or hard snow the blade end makes an excellent handhold.

HAMMER, PITON, MOUNTAIN Stock No. 74-H-50

A special hammer used by Mountain-Troops, to drive pitons into cracks in the rock and in ice. It may be secured to the wrist by a short leather thong looped through the hole in the handle.

SNAPLINKS, MOUNTAIN Stock No. 74-S-295

A steel link used to attach the mountain climbing or holding rope to the pitons and to transmit strain from the rope to the piton in the event of a fall. These are made to withstand a pull of 2000 lbs. and can be easily manipulated with one hand.


Fig. 1—The Snaplink, Mountain


Figs. 2 and 3—Piton, Mountain, Type I, attached to the Snaplink

Pitons, types I, II, III, and V, are soft iron spikes which are driven into cracks of various width and shapes in the rock to provide security for men or equipment in operations involving steep rock ascents. Type IV, a hollow tube, may be driven into ice for the same purpose.





Bag, sleeping, Arctic, M-1942, consists of two down and feather filled cases for use in extreme low temperatures. The inner bag is mummy shaped. A full length zipper is used to close the quilt shaped outer bag. A waterproof wrap case, having flaps and tie tapes, is provided for carrying both rolled bags. The stock of this bag is low.

There is also being issued under the same stock number a bag, sleeping, Arctic, which consists of two mummy shaped down and feather filled bags; case, water repellent, for bag, sleeping, mountain, and waterproof cover, for use in extreme low temperatures. Bag, sleeping, mountain, is used as the inner bag, and the outer bag is of similar design and construction. Tie tapes on the foot of bag, sleeping, Arctic, extend through openings in the bottom seam of case, water repellent, to hold the bags in a compact unit when rolled. A waterproof cover is provided to protect the bag. This bag is not illustrated.





Fig. 1—Bag, Sleeping, Mountain Fig. 2—Carrier, Bag, Sleeping, Mountain Fig. 3—Case, Water Repellent, Bag, Sleeping, Mountain Fig. 4—Bag, Sleeping, Mountain, Rolled Up

The bag, sleeping, mountain, is a mummy shaped, down and feather filled sleeping bag, made in regular and large size, in which an over-lapping tube construction prevents the entry of cold air at the stitching. The shape and design gives maximum warmth with minimum weight. Tie straps are attached to the foot of the bag. The case, water repellent, is made of poplin and provides a wind resistant cover for the sleeping bag. Two openings in the seam at the foot of the case, water repellent, allow the tie straps on the bag, sleeping, mountain, to be drawn to the outside to hold the items in a compact unit when rolled. A waterproof bag is provided for protecting the rolled bag.

The pad, insulating, sleeping, is issued for use with a sleeping bag. It provides insulation against cold and also resistance to transmission of moisture from the ground into the bag. The filled type pad, size 20" x 37", consists of a light weight filling material contained in a coated fabric case. It can be inflated slightly, but derives its insulating properties from the filling material. The inflated type pad, size 20" x 36", has no filling material but derives its insulating properties from the air cushion obtained when it is inflated.

Headnet, mosquito, is provided with a featherbone grommet to keep it away from the face, and is attached by means of a drawstring at the top to the helmet or other headgear. A drawstring at the bottom permits adjustment across the shoulders.



The jungle soldier is provided with two rubberized fabric bladders, each displacing between six and eight pounds of water. These bladders can be easily and rapidly inflated by blowing through a small rubber tube and then closing this tube by tucking the end under a fabric loop. When inflated the bladders will easily keep the wearer afloat. They can also be utilized as auxiliary canteens.

HAMMOCK, JUNGLE, COMPLETE Stock No. 74-H-60

Hammock, jungle, has been developed for use primarily by troops operating in densely wooded jungle areas where conditions do not permit bivouac on the ground. It combines the functions of a hammock, insect bar, and a waterproof tent fly and enables men to sleep off the ground thus avoiding dampness and insects while at the same time carrying the minimum weight and bulk of sleeping equipment. It can be pitched as an individual tent when the soldier is forced to sleep in treeless areas. Figures 1 and 2—The respective ends of the hammock, jungle. Figure 3—A side view.

Figure 1—The machete has a smooth, plastic handle, which must not be roughened or covered with adhesive tape if the efficiency of this tool is to be maintained. The machete must be sharpened to a tapered rolled knife edge by grinding it on a stone, sharpening, pocket, or a water-cooled, natural-stone grindstone. A hole is drilled in the handle of the machete for attaching a loose wrist cord to pass around the wrist and keep the machete from being dropped.

Figure 2—Sheath, machete, for the 18" machete is made of stout, water-repellent duck that resists mildew and jungle dampness. To keep the sheath from being cut by the machete a brass top and metal staples are used. The brass top also serves as a spring to grip the machete blade and thus prevent the machete from falling out of the sheath.


STONE, SHARPENING, POCKET Stock No. 41-S-5227


A small sharpening stone designed to sharpen all types of edged steel instruments such as machetes, knives, shovels, axes, bayonets, etc. Its coarse side is for restoring edges on dull or nicked instruments, and its fine side is for finishing edges so that they are keen and smooth. It weighs only $3\frac{3}{4}$ ounces and is $3\frac{1}{4} \times 1\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{16}$ inches in size.



BAR, INSECT, FIELD Stock No. 27-B-343

Bar, insect, field, is a netting canopy of relatively small mesh, designed for protection against sandflies and other small insects as well as mosquitoes. It has been basically designed for use with the shelter, tent, having tie tapes that correspond in location to the pegs of the tent, but it may also be used over cots or hospital beds. Shrinkage which will occur in laundering can be removed by stretching in use.



COVER, PROTECTIVE, !NDIVIDUAL

An expendable cover which can speedily be put on and will protect the individual from liquid vesicants and blistering gases sprayed from the air.

BAR, MOSQUITO

Stock No. 27-B-348

The bar, mosquito, was originally developed for barracks use, and is provided with a wide skirt of sheeting around the bottom to prevent damage when tucked in at the bottom of a metal wire-spring cot. For field use this item has been replaced by the bar, insect, field, which has a smaller mesh, and thereby protects against sandflies and other small insects as well as mosquitoes.


