



WWII NAVY CORPSMAN MEDICAL BRANDY 2.0

WWII Medical Apricot Brandy bottle labels as used by Navy Corpsman in WWII. One of the most difficult original items to locate for the WWII Corpsman collection, it is also rarely found in most WWII reenactors kits. A Corpsman would usually carry around a dozen bottles in a box in one of their UNIT bags. Some Marines were also issued bottles as part of their kit before an amphibious landing, check with your unit history or unit oral histories for more details if this was done or not.

Instructions:

- 1) Print IN COLOR on semi-gloss paper with adhesive backing.
- 2) Cut on the pink line. Pink line should not show on the label when finished.
- 3) 2 oz bottles should look like the example on the left. These bottles are available on ebay. After the bottles are cleaned you can fill it with apricot brandy if you wish.
- 4) Stick labels on the side of the bottle and across the top.
