1. Allowances in this column are on the basis of a month of 30 days. For a month of a greater or less number of days the amounts should be correspondingly increased or decreased.
2. Allowances fixed by the President: Suitable quarters in kind or in lieu thereof commutation of quarters at rate of \$6,500 per annum; necessary fuel and light for quarters in kind, or in lieu thereof commutation of fuel and light at rate of \$1,500 per annum. Order of the Secretary of War by direction of the President, November 16, 1920.
3. Entitled to rank and title of general; pay and allowances of a major general and to a money allowance of \$2,200 per year. (See sec. 7, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
4. Officers serving in the grade of lieutenant general shall be entitled while so serving to pay and allowances of a major general and to a personal money allowance of \$500 per year. (See sec. 7, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)

LAWS GOVERNING OFFICER PAY

1. FLYING PAY - Officers shall receive an increase of 50 per centum of their pay when by orders of competent authority they are required to participate regularly and frequently in aerial flights, and when in consequence of such orders they do participate in regular and frequent flights. (See sec. 18, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
2. PAY FOR FOREIGN SERVICE OR SEA DUTY.—The base pay of any commissioned officer shall be increased by 10 per centum for any period of service while on sea duty or duty in any place beyond the continental limits of the United States or in Alaska. The per centum increases herein authorized shall be included in computing increases in pay for aviation and submarine duty. This section shall be effective from December 7, 1941, and shall cease to be in effect twelve months after the termination of the present war is proclaimed by the President. (See sec. 2, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
3. AIDES - Additional pay is authorized for aides to a major general, not more than three in number, who shall be in the grade of captain or lieutenant. (R. S. 1098.)
 Additional pay is authorized for aides to a brigadier general, not more than two in number, who shall be in the grade of lieutenant. (R. S. 1098.)
 An aide to a major general is allowed \$200 and an aide to a brigadier general \$150 per year in addition to the pay of his rank. (R. S. 1261)
 Pay for aides to officers holding a permanent rank of brigadier general or major general but who are temporarily holding higher rank (such as lieutenant general) is authorized as shown in preceding paragraphs. See MS Comp. Gen. B-28710, October 9, 1942.
 The aides to a lieutenant general of a higher rank than those authorized by R. S. 1098 may not be paid.
4. SAVING CLAUSE - No person, active or retired, shall suffer any reduction in any pay, allowances, or compensation to which he was entitled upon the effective date of this act. (See sec. 19, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)

*Effective September 1, 1942, supply sergeants or technical sergeants (Air Corps) of a company or similar unit in a larger unit are enlisted men of the third grade; assistant supply sergeants of a regiment or separate battalion are enlisted men of the third grade.

LAWS GOVERNING ENLISTED PAY

- BASE PAY - The monthly base pay of enlisted men shall be: First grade, \$138; second grade, \$114; third grade, \$96; fourth grade, \$78; fifth grade, \$66; sixth grade, \$54; and seventh grade, \$50. (See sec. 9, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- LONGEVITY - Every enlisted man shall receive an increase of 5 per centum of the base pay of his grade for each three years of service up to thirty years. (See sec. 9, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- FLYING PAY - Enlisted men shall receive an increase of 50 per centum of their pay when by orders of competent authority they are required to participate regularly and frequently in aerial flights, and when in consequence of such orders they do participate in regular and frequent flights. (See sec. 18, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- PARACHUTISTS' PAY - Any enlisted man not in flying-pay status, who is assigned or attached as member of a parachute unit, including parachute-jumping schools, and for whom parachute jumping is an essential part of his military duty and who has received a rating as a parachutist or is undergoing training for such a rating shall receive, while engaged upon parachute duty, additional pay at the rate of \$50 per month. (See sec. 18, act June 16, 1942 (36 Stat. 3.59).)
- PAY FOR FOREIGN SERVICE OR SEA DUTY - The base pay of any enlisted man shall be increased by 20 per centum for any period of service while on sea duty or duty in any place beyond the continental limits of the United States or in Alaska. The per centum increases herein authorized shall be included in computing increases in pay for aviation and submarine duty. This section shall be effective from December 7, 1941, and shall cease to be in effect twelve months after the termination of the present war is proclaimed by the President. (See sec. 2, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- PAY FOR SPECIAL QUALIFICATION - Enlisted men may receive additional compensation, not less than \$1 nor more than \$5 per month, for special qualification in the use of the arm or arms which they may be required to use. (See sec. 16, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- PAY FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS - Enlisted men shall be entitled to additional pay at the rate of \$2 per month from the date of the distinguished act or service for which a medal of honor, a distinguished-service cross, a distinguished-service medal, a bar, or other suitable device, is awarded, or from the date of the act of heroism or extraordinary achievement for which the distinguished-flying cross or the soldier's medal, bar, or other suitable device, is awarded and said additional pay shall continue throughout his active service, whether such service shall or shall not be continuous. (See act July 9, 1918 (40 Stat. 871); and act July 2, 1926 (44 Stat. 789).)
- AVIATION CADETS - The base pay of any aviation cadet shall be \$75 per month, which pay shall include extra pay for flying risk, as provided by law. Aviation cadets shall be paid, in addition, a money allowance for subsistence of \$1 per day. No aviation cadet shall be entitled to receive longevity pay. (See sec. 4, act June 3, 1941 (55 Stat. 240) as amended by sec. 6, act July 8, 1942 (Public Law 658, 77th Congress), and for per diem rates for travel see AR 35-2580.)
- REGULAR ARMY RESERVE - Members of the Regular Army Reserve while on active duty shall have the same status and receive only the same pay and allowances provided by law for enlisted men of the active Regular Army of like grade and length of service. In computing length of service for pay purposes, time spent on active duty only will be counted. In addition, if found qualified and accepted for active duty, they shall receive a sum at the rate of \$3 per month for each month they have been enlisted in the Regular Army Reserve, but not to exceed \$150. (See sec. 30, act June 3, 1916 (39 Stat. 187); sec. 30, act June 4, 1920 (41 Stat. 775); act April 25, 1938 (52 Stat. 221); and sec. 9, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- ENLISTED RESERVE CORPS - Members of the Enlisted Reserve Corps while on active duty shall receive the same pay and allowances as other enlisted men of like grades and length of service. (See sec. 55b, added to act June 3, 1916, by sec. 35, act June 4, 1920 (41 Stat. 780); and sec. 9, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- RESERVE FORCES - Enlisted men of the Reserve forces of any of the services mentioned in the title of this Act, when on active duty in the service of the United States, shall be entitled to receive the same pay and allowances as are authorized for persons of corresponding grade and length of service in the Regular Army. (See sec. 14, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
- SOLDIERS' HOME DEDUCTIONS - Deductions for the maintenance of the United States Soldiers' Home will be made from the pay of enlisted men of the Regular Army, but not from the pay of enlisted men of the National Guard, Army of the United States, or selective trainees inducted into Federal Service. Act February 13, 1936 (49 Stat. 1137); and see AR 35-2440.

13. RESERVE OFFICERS' TRAINING CORPS - Members of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps shall be paid for attendance at advanced course camps at the rate prescribed for soldiers of the seventh grade of the Regular Army. (See sec. 47c added to act June 3, 1916, by sec. 34, act June 4, 1920 (41 Stat. 779).)
14. SELECTEES - To men inducted for training and service, there shall be paid, allowed, and extended the same pay, allowances, pensions, disability and death compensation, and other benefits as are provided by law in the case of other enlisted men of like grades and length of service. (See sec. 3 (d), act September 16, 1940 (54 Stat. 886).) See note 12 above.
15. ALLOWANCES FOR QUARTERS AND SUBSISTENCE - Enlisted men not furnished quarters or rations in kind are entitled to an allowance for quarters and subsistence not exceeding \$5 per day.

Each, enlisted man of the first, second, or third grade having a dependent shall be entitled to receive, for any period during which public quarters are not provided and available for his dependent, the monthly allowance for quarters authorized by law to be granted to each enlisted man not furnished quarters in kind. Such enlisted man shall continue to be entitled to this allowance although receiving the allowance provided in the first paragraph of this section if, by reason of orders of competent authority, his dependent is prevented from dwelling with him.

Enlisted men entitled to receive allowances for quarters or subsistence shall continue, while their permanent stations remain unchanged, to receive such allowances while sick in hospital or absent from their permanent-duty stations in a pay status. Allowances for subsistence shall not accrue to such an enlisted man while he is in fact being subsisted at Government expense. (See sec. 10, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
16. PAY OF RETIRED ENLISTED MEN ON ACTIVE DUTY - Retired enlisted men shall, when on active duty, receive full pay and allowances. (See sec. 15, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
17. ENLISTMENT ALLOWANCE - An enlistment allowance equal to \$50, multiplied by the number of years served in the enlistment period from which he has last been discharged, shall be paid to every honorably discharged enlisted man of the first three grades who reenlists within a period of three months from the date of his discharge, and an enlistment allowance of \$25, multiplied by the number of years served, to every honorably discharged enlisted man of the other grades who reenlists within a period of three months. (See sec. 10, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
18. SAVING CLAUSE - No person, active or retired, shall suffer any reduction in any pay, allowances, or compensation to which he was entitled upon the effective date of this Act. (See sec. 19, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat.359).)

LAWS GOVERNING WARRANT OFFICER PAY

1. LONGEVITY PAY - Every person paid under the provisions of this section shall receive an increase of 5 per centum of the base pay of his period for each 3 years of service, not exceeding 30 years. (See sec. 8, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
2. FLYING PAY - Warrant officers shall receive an increase of 50 per centum of their pay when by orders of competent authority they are required to participate regularly and frequently in aerial flights, and when in consequence of such orders they do participate in regular and frequent flights. (See sec. 18, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
3. SOLDIERS' HOME DEDUCTIONS - Deductions for the maintenance of the United States Soldiers' Home will be made for the pay of warrant officers of the Regular Army, but not from the pay of warrant officers of the National Guard while receiving Federal pay. (See AR 35-2220.)
4. LIMITATION ON PAY AND ALLOWANCES - When the total pay and allowances of a warrant officer shall exceed the rate of \$458.33 per month, the amount of the allowances shall be reduced by the amount above \$458.33. (See sec. 8, act June 16, 1942 (56 Stat. 359).)
